AAU MEMBERSHIP:	All athletes, coaches, scorekeeper and bat-persons must hold a current AAU membership. In addition, all teams must hold a current AAU club membership.		
RULES OF PLAY:	The most current High School Baseball Rules as published by the National Federation of State High School Districts except where modified (see AAU Baseball Handbook). Games will be seven (7) innings in length. The 10-run/15-run rule will be in effect except in gold through bronze medal games.		
	The time limit for the National Tournament will be 2 hours and 15 minutes. There will be no games ending in a tie. Games will be played until there is a winner. However there will be no NEW inning starting after the time limit expires if the game is not tied. There will be no time limit in any medal game in the championship or classic rounds.

CHECK-IN:	<b>On-Site Check-in</b> : On Saturday, July 19 <sup>th</sup> , all teams must officially check in from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 PM. Each team will be assigned a registration time in the form of a CONFIRMATION NOTICE, which will be sent to your primary contact and posted on the AAU Baseball Website.		
	Only coaches must be present at check-in with all required materials. Please have copies of all forms, including birth certificates, submitted with your entry.		
PLAYER AGE DETERMINATION:	All players must have been born on or after <u>May 1, 1994</u> . Proof of age will be required at time of entry. Only the following documents are acceptable:		
	<ol> <li>A photocopy of his/her birth record from the state, county or municipal bureau of vital statistics of the place of birth.</li> <li>A photocopy of the delayed registration of birth (originals may be requested) if the athlete's birth was not recorded on the day of birth, issued by the same bodies.</li> <li>Consular Service Form FS-240, "Report on Birth" issued by the U.S. State Department.</li> <li>Immigration and naturalization forms I-151 and I-25 and Form No. 43-R311-7 issued by the U.S. Department of Justice.</li> <li>A valid Passport, Drivers License, or Homeland Security Card.</li> </ol>		
	HOSPITAL RECORDS ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE!!		
PLAYER ROSTER:	Rosters are limited to a maximum of 20 players. A team advancing to an AAU National Championship from at least a three (3) team qualifier shall be allowed to add or replace up to five (5) players on its AAU District roster (to a team maximum of twenty).		
COACHES:	Each team is entitled to a maximum of three (3) bench personnel (head coach and assistants) and (1) one scorekeeper. Each individual must be a registered as an AAU non-athlete.		
COACHES' ATTIRE:	Coaches do not need to be in full uniform, but should be in <b>appropriate matching athletic attire consistent with the team uniform</b> (such as collared shirts and coaches shorts, with athletic shoes).		
BATPERSONS:	No more than two (2) bat-persons may be registered by each team, provided that each bat-person is between the ages 8-18 at the time of the tournament and is a registered as an AAU non-athlete. Bat persons must wear helmets when in live playing areas.		
COACHES' MEETING:	SATURDAY, JULY 19 <sup>th</sup> at 3:00 PM. This meeting is <u>MANDATORY &amp; WITHOUT</u> <u>EXCEPTION</u> : The head coach and assistant coach from each team is required to attend (limit 2 coaches per team additional coaches will not be allowed entry). Non-compliance may result in the disqualification of your team without refund of entry fee.		
	***If a team representative does not attend the preliminary coaches meeting, the head coach of that team will be suspended for one game in each instance.		
OPENING CEREMONIES:	SATURDAY, JULY 19 <sup>th</sup> at 5:00PM.		
	Also, several teams may bring "Team Pins" to exchange during opening ceremonies and during the week. You may consider participating in this activity. Usually, the pins have a team, state or city logo. Please no trading of Pins at the check-in area.		
CLOSING CEREMONIES:	Closing Ceremonies will be held for all medal-winning teams and for the "All Tournament Team Members". This includes 1 <sup>st</sup> -8 <sup>th</sup> place teams in the "Championship Bracket" and the 1 <sup>st</sup> and 2 <sup>nd</sup> place teams in the "Classic Bracket." These ceremonies will take place immediately following each "medal" game. Teams will be instructed to walk over the to medal ceremony by AAU/ <i>Disney</i> representatives. This will be a semi-formal ceremony in where pictures will be allowed.		
AWARDS:	Team trophies and individual medals will be awarded to the top eight- (8) teams in the medal round. Team trophies will be awarded to the top two- (2) teams in the classic bracket. A Sportsmanship Trophy will also be awarded to a team or individual that exemplifies the award during the tournament. The presentation of awards will be held immediately following the completion of the each Championship Game (1 <sup>st</sup> -8 <sup>th</sup> place and Classic 1 <sup>st</sup> & 2 <sup>nd</sup> ). In addition, a twenty- (20) member All-Tournament Team will be selected.		

COMPETITION FORMAT:	In general, the seven- (7) days of competition will consist of:		
	<ol> <li><u>Two (2) days of initial pool play.</u> Following completion of initial pool play, at least the top two finishers in each initial pool will advance to the championship pools and the remaining teams will be placed in consolation pools.</li> </ol>		
	<ol> <li>Three (3) days of championship/consolation pool play. Not less than two teams from each championship pool will advance to the championship bracket. The number of teams advancing from the consolation pools to the consolation bracket will be determined based on the total number of participating teams.</li> </ol>		
	3. <u>Two (2) days of championship/consolation bracket play.</u> The championship bracket will be a "modified single elimination playoff "under which first through eighth places will be determined. The consolation bracket will be single elimination. Places fifth through eighth will not play for order of finish; however, runs allowed, runs scored, head to head, higher seed, and finally a coin flip if necessary, will determine ranking. Medals and trophies will still be awarded to all top eight finishers.		
	<b>NOTE:</b> Particular circumstances may result in some deviation from the described tournament format, subject to the prior approval of the National AAU Baseball Competition Task Group.		
	In the event of inclement weather, the Tournament Director reserves the right to change the tournament formats to ensure completion of the tournament. If any portion of the tournament is delayed or modified due to inclement weather or any other cause, all participating teams are expected to play at any time. No exceptions will be made to accommodate travel plans made for the rain date.		
AAU PATCH:	An Official AAU Baseball Patch must be affixed to the left sleeve of the uniform jersey or over the left chest of a sleeveless uniform jersey worn by both player and coach alike during NATIONAL TOURNAMENT competition. <b>PENALTY: The violator of this rule MAY be ejected as determined by the tournament director.</b>		
CONDUCT:	Players' and coaches' conduct should be above reproach, both on and off the diamond. Any misconduct will result in disqualification from the championship. Coaches listed on the official team roster will be responsible for the conduct of their players and fans for any damages incurred to the motel(s) or facilities used by their roster players. Any player or coach who is ejected from a game will also be disqualified from that team's following game. The second occurrence during the tournament results in suspension for the remainder of the tournament as well as possible imposition of further sanctions.		
PROTESTS:	Protests must be made verbally with the umpire by the offended team at the time of the play and before the next pitch. A fee of \$100.00 cash (refunded if upheld) must accompany the protest. All decisions of the protest committee shall be final. Only decisions involving the misinterpretation or misapplication of a rule may be protested. No protest shall be allowed in matters involving solely the officials' judgment.		
SPECTATOR ADMISSION:	Spectator admission is required for all events at the Cherry Park Complex. Daily admission will be available for \$10 for children 6 and older. Also, a length of event (LOE) pass may be purchased for \$40 for children 6 and older. You may purchase your passes at the Check in or at the Opening Ceremony.		
COOLER POLICY:	NO COOLERS WILL BE PERMITTED IN DUGOUTS, WATER WILL BE PROVIDED. In addition, no outside food will be allowed in baseball complexes.		
TRANSPORTATION AND PARKING:	Teams are responsible for their own transportation to and from Baseball Complex.
